
APRIL 2025 LUMC Newsletter Pastor's Column

MISSION OF THE MONTH

April Mission of the Month is to the Cokesbury Lunch and Learn Summer Program run by Marcus Hook UMC. July to mid August, K to 3rd graders come to the morning program and free lunch that are tailored to the 3 elementary schools with-in walking distance of the church. 20-35 children attend daily with a few walk-in 18 yo and younger for lunch. This free lunch is funded by the Summer Food Service Program of PA Dept. of Education.

Outside funding is needed to cover stipends for one elementary school teacher and two helpers, new age appropriate books, art supplies, backpacks, and school supplies. Donations also fund special programs (2024 included a traveling zoo, PALS for Life, local police men come to read stories, and firemen to demonstrate fire safety). All these special programs provide enrichment for the students who are not able to take family day trips. This is an excellent mission outreach program for summer education of God's young children who are only a few miles from Lima. Our heartfelt generosity will nourish the children of Marcus Hook in mind, body, and spirit. Cokesbury Lunch and Learn Program truly appreciate your prayers and donations.
